**POSITION:**

Tenure track or tenured faculty member in Operations and Supply Chain Management at any level (Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor). Duties include: teaching undergraduate and graduate courses; regular publication of research; and providing service to the department, college, university, and profession. Teaching will include operations management and supply chain courses with opportunities to teach other courses as well. Research expectations include regular publications in any area of operations and supply chain management, as well as other research-related activities.

**DATE OF APPOINTMENT:**

August 16, 2012

**QUALIFICATIONS:**

A Ph.D. or D.B.A. from an AACSB-accredited program, and demonstrated professional and/or academic experience in the field of supply chain management is expected.

**FACULTY:**

The Department of Management has nine faculty members teaching in the areas of general management, operations management, human resource management, supply chain management, strategic management, international business, ethics, leadership, and other management-related topics. The Department offers undergraduate degrees in Management, Operations and Supply Chain Management, and Human Resource Management. Working with the School of Aerospace Sciences, degrees in Aviation Management and Airport Management are also offered. The department also offers courses as part of the college's MBA program. The Department is part of the AACSB-accredited College of Business and Public Administration, which includes 60 full-time faculty members.

**COLLEGE:**

The College of Business and Public Administration has an enrollment of over 1800 students pursuing bachelors and masters level degrees. The College is home to the Center For Innovation, including incubator facilities, and the state office of the Small Business Development Center. Students have the opportunity to participate in a variety of experiential learning opportunities including internships, study abroad programs, a student-managed investment fund, and a student-run venture capital investment fund.

**UNIVERSITY AND COMMUNITY:**

The University of North Dakota is one of two major research universities in the state. It offers degrees in the professional areas of law, medicine, aviation, and engineering, as well as doctorates in the hard sciences, social sciences, and education. University enrollment is approximately 13,000. The University has world-class athletic and fitness facilities, including the Ralph Engelstad Arena, the Betty Engelstad Sioux Center, and the UND Student Wellness Center. The Grand Forks metropolitan area has a population of over 90,000, and is approximately two hours from Winnipeg (Canada) and the Minnesota lakes area. The community offers a strong public school system, low crime rates, and a variety of cultural and recreational activities. The State of North Dakota has continued to run a budget surplus throughout the past ten years, with regular raises provided to all state employees.

**A FEW MORE DETAILS:**

- A demonstrated record of research and teaching in operations and supply chain management is strongly preferred, as is hiring someone at the advanced assistant, associate, or full professor level.

- The successful applicant would be expected to be able teach operations management and supply chain management related courses, including logistics management. In addition, the ability to teach quantitative analysis, and other operations management related courses would be valued. The ability to teach other management related courses, including principles of management, would also be helpful.
- The normal teaching load in the department is 2-3 courses per semester, with at most two different preparations per semester. A proven and ongoing record of regular publications may provide the opportunity for a reduction in the teaching load.
- Individuals who have not yet completed their Ph.D. will be considered only if there is a strong probability that the degree will be completed by August 2012.

**APPLICATIONS:**

A letter of application, list of references that may be contacted, and current vita should be sent to the department chair listed below. Finalists will be expected to provide three letters of recommendation; documented evidence of teaching effectiveness; and original transcripts. Applicants will be reviewed on a rolling basis beginning in October 2011. The position will remain open until filled, and all applications will be considered until the position has been filled.
